Renovation Update

I am continuing to work with the City Council to develop a phase one funding plan. Two public discussions are a development of this work and will occur on Wednesday August 9 (directly following our board meeting) and Thursday August 10, 6 pm 2nd floor community meeting room at the VPL. Programs/Events

Program attendance is increasing compared to last year. Feels like we are almost fully recovered from the two year COVID disruption. Having two librarians focusing on programs and getting new people through the door is really beneficial to growing our user base. We registered 86 new library cards in the month of July! Looking forward to fall, we'll be working with the school district to get freshmen signed up for e-cards. We are also planning a banned books read-a-thon during the week of Oct 1 - 7 to celebrate our freedom to read. On the Horizon

My hope is to have the funding formula for the renovation on the council agenda for a vote in Sept or Oct. Part of what I hear from the mayor and council is they would like to have more public education about the project before they make a decision on funding. There is a fear of "ramming this down the collective throat" before anyone has had a chance to know about it/weigh in, hence the upcoming meetings. I also think there's a vocal minority whose vision for the future is simply less taxes which means continued deferred responsibility for municipal assets.

The attendance and outcome of the public conversations will help frame what the next steps look like. It may be strategic to form a capital campaign committee whose role is raising awareness, then raising funds. I am still hesitant at spending any more of our donated funds on a professional fundraising consultant. At this point, let's hope the council exercises some leadership and stewardship.
