Director's Report

Renovation Update

I am working on coordinating the AV / Data / Communication aspect of the renovation. Basically, looking for a company who will work with the contractor and architect to get all of the technology we need incorporated into the building. Staff and I continue to plan the move to the Beaser Ave site and "get rid of stuff". I met with the public works/facilities team and they are willing to help us move our non-collection things (office stuff, chairs, file cabinets). I will be meeting with the Book Nook committee to discuss their plans for 2025.

Grants & Capital Campaign

I do have some news and we can discuss, celebrate at the meeting. Currently, the information I have to share is not public but will be soon. Also, the Friends have agreed to increase their contribution to \$100,000 (was \$50,000) which will put us right on budget for Phase One. We did not receive the Otto Bremer Foundation grant, so it is very fortunate our Friends are in a position to help with additional funding. If you are not a Friend, please join!
